The Consonants S and Z are represented not only by the strokes) and) but also by a small circle o. Initially the circle represents the light sound of s initially medially and finally it represents the sound of s or z. The sound of z initially must be represented by the stroke) as
Zeal Zeal Zero Zenith
The circle S when alone is written with the left motion.

The circle s is written (a) inside curve (b) outside angles formed by two straight stroke and (c) with the left motion when joined to straight stroke not forming an angle as.

(a) Inside the Curve
